I am so blessed to be part of such an amazing school and community. As we approach our 10<sup>th</sup> year as a school, I can't help but reflect on all the wonderful families, events, and growth I have witnessed over this time. The love and commitment to children is endless and it is through this that we have been able to develop and maintain our wonderful programs.

Over the past ten years we have served many families in our community by developing preschool and elementary programs that provide active and individualized techniques with a very hands on approach to learning. We enjoy introducing our students to different cultures as part of our school curriculum by choosing an all school country of study. Last year we were introduced to Japan and this year we will explore Russia.

We are proud to teach our students the meaning of community as part of their educational experience. We learn about community through a variety of activities in the classroom and throughout the year students share in helping with local and global charities. Last year the school participated in the charity called the "Wells of Love" a service learning program of Amman Imman: Water is Life, helping bring water and hope to the 500,000 people of the Azawak of West Africa. This year our school will support local organizations in need, such as our local food bank and broadreach program.

We have also designed educational, inspiring and fun summer camp programs open to any child ages 3-12. Along with our normal science and art studies where campers explore local parks, ponds, and forests this past summer older campers were introduced to technology with clay animation and video production, puppet making and drama. They also enjoyed wood working and building. All campers enjoyed visitors from local preserves and produced, participated and displayed their art in gallery form during an art show.

None of the success or continued growth in our school programs would have been possible without key individuals, groups and supporters. It is through the efforts of the board of directors, who graciously volunteer their time to uphold our schools mission and keep the school financially viable, and the amazing staff and faculty who go above and beyond their call of duty to create and maintain an environment for children where they can feel safe, loved, nurtured, appropriately challenged, and honored for their curiosity, that we have been able to create such a special place. However, it is the parents, children and the outside community that glue us all together. Without your continued support and words of encouragement we would not be where we are today.

I am proud to be part of the Cornerspring Montessori Community and all the lives it has touched over the last ten years. I look forward to continuing the learning, traditions and community building for years to come.

## Our Programs

#### **Preschool and Kindergarten Programs**

Cornerspring offers several choices for preschool programs based on the needs of the child. At the preschool/kindergarten age, students gain experience through many hands on materials and develop



skills at their specific level of understanding preparing them for more complex lessons. The classroom environment is set up to allow for individualized and self explorative learning which stimulates, fosters and nurtures the love for learning that will continue throughout life. Our highly trained teachers observe the children through this environment and introduce them to developmentally challenging activities in practical life skills, sensorial, language, mathematics,

cultural studies and social activities.

#### **Elementary Programs**

The Montessori approach is designed to assist the child in acquiring the social skills and self confidence that are needed to fulfill his or her own potential. This is accomplished by building on interests, nurturing enthusiasm and making activities available to fit individual needs. Students follow a written study plan jointly arrived at by the teacher and student where they are supported in planning and completing work.



#### Before and after care services

Cornerspring offers before care services for students within the community beginning at 7:30 a.m. during the normal school year. Public school students are bused to the local schools in the RSU 20 district. Before care services may be available during summer camp based on need.

Cornerspring also provides after care services for students within the community beginning at 3:00 p.m. until 5:30 p.m. during the normal school year. Public school students from CASS or Drinkwater are bused to the school.

#### **Summer Camp Programs**

Summer camp programs are offered within the community for two different age groupings. Cornerspring offers 8 separate one week sessions of summer camp for preschool or kindergarten age children (3 to 6 year olds) and elementary age children (6-12 years old).



Last year we were able to use our funding to provide fieldtrips to many different learning and explorative outings. Our children visited the State Museum in Augusta, the Farnsworth Art Museum in Rockland, Fort Knox and Moosepoint State park, and Belfast City Park. We also enjoyed exploring ponds, oceans, and forests as we learned about subject areas surrounding these habitats. Tony Sohns, a local naturalist visited our camp often to teach us about bugs, lizards and plants.

#### **Enrichment Programs**

Art, music, drama, foreign language and naturalists are among the added enrichments we offer at our



school. We are fortunate to have an on staff art teacher who not only provides lessons and education on artist and their styles, but teaches techniques and explores art based on our cultural unit for the year. Music is incorporated in with many of our daily rituals and has expanded in years past to include chorus. The elementary students have enjoyed learning different drama techniques which become useful in their educational presentations throughout the school year. Elementary students are introduced to a foreign language of choice through a well known computerized curriculum. Younger students are introduced to the concept of different languages through our country of study and different

nationalities within our community. Special enrichment programs happen throughout the school year. This past year the elementary students visited Tanglewood 4-H camp to learn about ecology as well as bond together for an overnight camping experience while the younger friends experienced ecology onsite.

#### **Cultural Study**

Ever year Cornerspring chooses a school wide country to study so that as a group we can learn different aspects of that country. Each classroom tailors their study based on age appropriate stories, music, geographical make up, language(s) cultural studies and artifacts. Towards the end of the year, the entire school participates in a celebration based on one of the countries rituals or celebrations. Last year we enjoyed studying Japan and its wonderful culture. This January we will begin our study Russia.

#### **Peace Education**

Cornerspring incorporate peace education in their curriculum by introducing students to different peace educators, reading poems, stories and singing songs surrounding peace. At the beginning of the year, the school joins together in a school wide peace celebration in recognition of the International Day of Peace.
